A Few Words About this Worship Booklet


In the year 1840, Blessed Basile Moreau, the founder of the Congregation of Holy Cross, sent Brother André Mottais, Brother Alphonsus Rodriguez Tulou, novice Brother Ignace Feron, Father Le Boucher and Father Victor Drouelle to Algiers, the Congregation's first-ever overseas mission. To mark the 185th Anniversary of their sending, and to celebrate the sending of 8 of our Holy Cross missionaries (4 Brothers and 4 Priests from 7 Jurisdictions and 5 countries) to the Holy Family Mission in the Diocese of Bougainville in Papua New Guinea (PNG), our Superior General, Br. Paul Bednarczyk, C.S.C., announced a Year of Mission with the theme, Hope Beyond Borders, for celebration by the whole family of Holy Cross.

To facilitate this celebration, the General Council created a task force to provide resources for use during this Year of Mission. This booklet is one such resource. It offers Morning Prayer and Evening Prayer for both the opening (April 28, 2025) and the closing (April 28, 2026) celebrations for the Year of Mission. Please feel free to adapt it to your needs and circumstances.

May the Co-Patrons of this Year of Mission, Servants of God Flavian Laplante and Vincent McCauley, intercede for us all.



Introduction

Leader: Today we celebrate the 185th Anniversary of Blessed Basile Moreau sending the first Holy Cross men beyond the borders of France in 1840. We also begin today a Year of Mission, during which the whole Family of Holy Cross will reflect on our purpose, seek to renew our zeal, and ask how we might revitalize our charism in light of the Church's and society's current needs. This is a time for reflecting on how we can be people "with hope to bring" to a world in which the light of hope is in danger of being extinguished for so many of our brothers and sisters. During this special year set aside for discernment, we are called to renew our pledge to join in deeper solidarity with "men and women of grace and goodwill everywhere in their ef-forts to form communities of the coming Kingdom." As part of the larger family of Holy Cross let us offer our Morning Prayer for God's blessings on all.

If such were the case, however, the Congregation would have been a merely human combination and not the work of Divine Providence. The fact of the matter is that it began and developed in a manner so mysterious, that I can claim for myself neither credit for its foundation nor merit for its progress. Therein lies the indubitable proof that God alone is the Founder of this Congregation, since, according to St. Augustine, when we cannot find the cause of a good work, we must recognize that the Lord is its beginning and author. 



Introduction

READING

What is true of a palace whose foundations have been laid, and which is rising gradually until completion is verified, likewise, in a great work of charity. Brother Flavian Laplante, C.S.C.

Born in Québec, Canada, Br. Flavian entered Holy Cross at the age of 16. Upon Final Profession in 1928, he worked at Collège Notre-Dame before heading to the Congregation's mission in East Bengal (present-day Bangladesh and India) in 1932. He was a builder of schools and orphanages, a teacher, an administrator, a principal of schools and a hermit.

In May 1942, when the Japanese Army started air raids on Chittagong, Br. Flavian went to assist. There he met the fishermen to whom he devoted most of the rest of his life. After completing 49 years of service to the poor in Bangladesh, he died there on June 19, 1981. In the words of the Congregation's *Constitutions*, Br. Flavian "[came] not just as servants but as their neighbors, to be with them and of them" (2:13).

Flavian was declared a Servant of God on February 13, 2009 – the Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes – by Most Rev. Patrick D'Rozario, Bishop of Chittagong Diocese, Bangladesh. His cause is being advanced by coordinated work in Bangladesh and in Canada.





BISHOP VINCENT McCauley

Born in Iowa in the United States, Bishop McCauley from his childhood dreamed of being a missionary. After studying in the Congregation's Foreign Mission Seminary, he was sent to East Bengal where he worked among the Kuki Christians near Agartala. Sickness, however, forced him to return to the United States.

Bishop McCauley persevered in his desire to serve in the missions, and in 1958, he led the Congregation's new mission to Uganda. In 1961, he was appointed bishop of the newly created Diocese of Fort Portal. In addition to building the diocese from the ground up, he was known for his compassion, guiding the Church in aiding countless refugees, widows, and orphans during the political turmoil of the 1960s and 70s. For him, as the *Constitutions* state, "The face of every human being who suffers is for us the face of Jesus" (8:114).

He died on November 1, 1982 and was buried in the Holy Cross community cemetery at Notre Dame on November 4. In August 2006, the cause for canonization of Bishop McCauley, C.S.C., was introduced in the Congregation of Saints. As Servant of God, Bishop McCauley's cause undergoes review by the Diocese of Fort Portal, Uganda, Holy Cross seeks to emulate his faith, talent, energy, and joy – gifts by which he made God known, loved, and served.
